



# Did You Know?



## Fraser Cemetery

The fenced cemetery plot you pass when transiting from the White #4 green to the White #5 tee at Arlington represents only a small portion of the plot set aside by the Fraser family for the internment of its members. The family also made provisions for a chapel immediately adjacent to the cemetery plot.

## Fraser Cemetery

On August 13, 1958 when Army Navy Country Club acquired the last of the leased property (12.3896 acres from the estate of Frances Lee Sickles), we inherited the Fraser family cemetery, the accompanying chapel site and a perpetual maintenance provision. The fenced area near the White #5 tee measures 28' 6.5" X 24' 5". This area represents only 6.3% of the cemetery plot depicted on the property plat below. This percentage ignores the nearly equally sized "Chapel Lot" immediately adjacent to the cemetery.



We do not know if a chapel was ever constructed. Nor do we know if the remainder of the cemetery plot was used for the internment of non-family members. However, it is obvious from the size of the cemetery plot that the Fraser family expected to be around for several generations.
