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Bell Arlington Ridge Apartments

With the exception of two plots owned by Army, Navy, and Marine Corps Country Club and 31.123 acres rented from H.P. Carter, all of the Club's property resided to the east of Camp Convalescent Road (Army Navy Drive and 24th Road).

The two properties owned by the Club on the west side of the road were acquired as follows:

A: 4.696 acres from Betty V. Stoneburner on June 12, 1929.

B: 3.204 acres from H.P. Carter on April 9, 1931

Both of these properties were impacted by the construction of the Shirley highway and their remnants were later dealt to the Arlington School Board in exchange for the re-routing of a right-of-way that may have impacted the #5 (Red #5) green and some additional property at the northwest corner of the Arlington campus.



Property “C” was also owned by Betty V. Stoneburner, but when it was offered to the Club, the Executive Committee, at their October 26, 1932, meeting, declined the offer as they considered the property not “necessary or desirable for Club use”. Unlike “A” and “B”, The Stoneburner property (“C”) was not impacted by the Shirley Highway construction (see plat below) and remained in the Stoneburner family until 1959 when it was sold to Conduit 95 Corporation who constructed a motel on the site the following year. The motel passed through two sales (to Imperial 400 National, Inc. (1986) and Louisiana Hospitality, Inc. (1992)) before being demolished to facilitate the construction of today’s Bell Arlington Ridge Apartments (2010).
